- 3. A frail 70 years old patient with ischaemic heart disease presents for a thoracotomy. Discuss the factors that you consider when choosing a method of pain management.
- 4. Outline the anatomy of nerve supply to the larynx and effects of nerve injury.
- 5. Discuss the effects of smoking abstinence in the perioperative period.
- 6. Outline your selection criteria for day surgery in paediatrics.
- 7. Describe the anatomy of the ilioinguinal nerve with reference to performing the ilioinguinal nerve block and its complications.
- 8. Discuss the role of gabapentin in modern anaesthetic practice.
- 9. Discuss the statement: "All hip fractures should be fixed within 24 hours of admission".
