- A 65 year-old-man requires emergency tracheal stenting under general anaesthesia for a suspected bronchogenic carcinoma causing airway obstruction at the carina level. Discuss your perioperative concerns.
- 2. Discuss the causes and treatment for uterine hypertonia.
- 3. A patient developed ventricular fibrillation which is not terminated by repeated delivery of electrical defibrillation. Outline the factors that influence the success of defibrillation.
- 4. Describe the effect of inhalational anaesthetic agents (25%), intravenous induction agents (50%) and opioids (25%) on somatosensory evoked potential and motor evoked potential.
- 5. Outline the features of a modern anaesthetic workstation that ensure safe gas delivery to the patient.
- 6. Insertion of a central line may result in cardiac tamponade:
  - a) How would you recognize this complication? (50%)
  - b) How could you minimize the risk of this complication? (50%)
- 7. A 45-year-old man with a history of alcohol abuse and recent acute pancreatitis is admitted to the intensive care unit for inotropic and ventilatory support following a laparotomy to drain the pancreatic abscess. His body mass index is 18kg/m<sup>2</sup>.
  - i) Justify the need for nutritional support in this patient and list the components of the nutritional requirement. (50%)
  - ii) Outline the pros and cons of the options available to provide nutritional support to this patient. (50%)
- 8. You are asked to review a woman in the anaesthetic outpatient clinic. She had two previous caesarean sections and is currently 32 weeks pregnant with an anterior lying placenta praevia and a fibroid uterus. She is otherwise healthy and scheduled for an elective caesarean section at 39 weeks of gestation.
  - Describe and justify your peripartum management in this patient.
- A 60-year-old man is scheduled for resection of a large back lipoma under general anaesthesia
  on your list tomorrow, the surgeon requests for a prone position for this procedure. Describe
  your anaesthetic management.
