- 1. Outline the adverse effects of non-selective NSAIDs. What improvements have the selective COX- 2 inhibitors made to these effects.
- 2. Compare and contrast remifentanil with fentanyl.
- 3. Compare and contrast the <u>cerebrovascular</u> effects of isoflurane and propofol.
- 4. Compare and contrast the pharmacology of sodium nitroprusside and glyceryl tritrate.
- 5. Describe briefly the non-hypnotic effects of ketamine.
- 6. Outline the disposition of bupivacaine administered into the lumbar epidural space.
- 7. Outline the factors that determine the onset of neuromuscular block. Compare suxamethonium with rocuronium with regard to this.
- 8. Dolasetron in a new anti-emetic drug. Describe how you would devise a clinical trial to determine the efficacy of this drug as an anti-emetic in the post-operative period.
- 9. Outline the pharmacology and clinical uses of mannitol.
- 10. Describe the extrahepatic metabolism of drugs relevant to anaesthesia.
- 11. Illustrate with examples how different classes of drugs could alter gastric pH.
- 12. Outline the factors affecting the uptake of volatile anaesthetic agents.
