- Q.2 Briefly describe the clinical features, proposed mechanisms and management options for patients with fibromyalgia.
- Q.3 Comment on the usefulness of Waddell's signs for assessing patients with back pain.
- Q.4 A 30-year-old male intravenous drug addict had open reduction and internal fixation for fractured femur 7 days ago. He still requires intravenous patient controlled analgesia of morphine 100 mg per day and refused to ambulate. Outline your management.
- Q.5 Briefly outline the mechanisms for pain sensitization.
- Q.6 Explain 'yellow flag' in pain assessment. Describe your management of patients with these features.
- Q.7 Compare and contrast the application of facet joint block and medial branch block in patients with facet joint disease.
- Q.8 Discuss different approaches and tools that you would use to assess burns dressing pain in a 6 year old child and a 14 year old adolescent.
