Scenario 1:

A 50-year-old obese woman was scheduled for a laparoscopic cholecystectomy. Due to technical difficulties the operation was converted to an open procedure

- Q1 Discuss the relative merits of thoracic epidural analgesia, and PCA morphine in this patient?
- Q2 Despite morphine PCA, the following morning when reviewed by you she still complains of significant pain. List the possible causes of inadequate analgesia.
- Q3 3 months later, the hospital received a letter from her solicitor requesting an explanation for the pain and suffering during the post-operative period. Hospital management asked you to provide an explanation regarding the physical and psychological distress that may have occurred. What would be the main points in your answer?

Scenario 2:

A 25-year-old intravenous drug addict accidentally injected heroin into his brachial artery. He presents with incipient ischaemia of his fingers.

- Q1 Briefly discuss techniques that you could use to improve blood flow and provide analgesia.
- Q2 A week later, despite treatment, the patient develops gangrene of 3 fingers. The surgeon decides to amputate the fingers. Discuss the role of pre-emptive analysesia in this patient.
- Q3 1 month later, the patient developed phantom pain. Outline your management.

Scenario 3:

A 45-year-old lady had radical mastectomy for left breast cancer. Three years later she develops severe left sided chest pain.

- Q1 List the possible causes of the pain and outline how you would confirm the diagnosis.
- Q2 A rib secondary is discovered. Other than oral analgesics, what other modalities could be used to manage pain in this patient?
- Q3 If an intercostal block with phenol is considered, how would you obtain informed consent?
