- 1. Compare and contrast clinical pharmacology of medical cannabis and morphine in the context of pain management.
- 2. Discuss the use of intravenous magnesium in pain medicine.
- 3. A middle-aged man had intrathecal morphine pump inserted 2 years ago. His lumber pain has been under control using this drug delivery device until recently. Please describe your approach to manage his worsening back pain.
- 4. Outline the factors that affect the quality of platelet-rich plasma.
- 5. What are the definitions of nausea and vomiting? List the causes and corresponding treatment of nausea and vomiting in palliative care patients.
- 6. Discuss the role of neurophysiological tests in diagnosis of neuropathic pain.
- 7. Mr. Chan is a 40-year-old driver who had sustained severe cervical spinal cord injury at C7 level 2 months ago. He had completed cervical fixation surgery. He complained of persistent pain over the trunk and limbs, so consulted the pain team for advice.
 - a) Explain the pathophysiology of neuropathic pain in spinal cord injury. (50%)
 - b) How would you assess Mr Chan's pain condition? (50%)
- 8. Define Chronic Primary Musculoskeletal Pain. Outline its symptoms and nonpharmacological treatments.
- Briefly outline the possible pathophysiological and psychosocial causes of Orofacial Pain, according to the 2020 Classifications by International Headache Society . (70%) What are important questions in history to ask to guide the diagnosis (30%)
